President's Message

What do you do during the heat of the Summer? I have been working in the garden very early and at sunset. It reminds me of my Colorado days during the Winter. It was a time of planning, shopping in catalogs, and checking notes throughout the season. One of the tasked I tackled was to document when each species/cultivar bloomed. I have started this at my Florida garden also. I grow most of my bromeliads in the garden, ground and in the trees, except for a few rare ones that I am finally setting up a shade cloth area for them.

In my Colorado garden, it was full on temperate plants that all have their week of glory. Annuals were the only plants that would have a longer bloom period. This allowed for the same section of the garden to have different color schemes throughout the growing season. I want to attempt this in my garden here, such as a selection of red, white, and blue blooms during national holiday times in my front yard near the street area. Or, my orange and blue section that would bloom during football season. I plant my bromeliads with other native plants and long blooming tropicals,. When the bromeliads bloom, it gives an extra accent to the planted area. Lately, if I have an area which is too dense of straight bromeliads, I allow Florida native wildflowers to grow between them.

Neoregelias are a certain color option. I have found that that can be very variable with seasonal change and sun/shade situations. I have 3 'Candy apples" in my front garden, mother and pup, and a pup off the pup. All 3 of them are different, even though they came from the same mother plant bought 3 years ago. Colorful Neoregelias are an excellent foreground for green foliage bromeliads, like Aechmeas. When the Aechmeas (or others) bloom, it accents the color in that area.

I am desperately trying to catch up with my cataloging the species/cultivars and hybrids of my bromeliads. Steve suggested the "Plant Album" app. This allows you to catalogue the plants, make notes, and add pictures. Are there any others that are in use by our members?

2025 Bromeliad Extravaganza

September 26th to 27th, 2025 Kissimmee, Florida (near Disney) Conference Registration Fee: \$125 (Online Registration or Mail-In)

Sponsored by the <u>Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies</u> and hosted by the <u>Seminole</u> <u>Bromeliad & Tropical Plant Society</u>, this will be Florida's biggest Bromeliad event of the year!

The **Bromeliad Extravaganza** will include a Friday night dinner (BBQ buffet), three Saturday afternoon seminars (including <u>Leonardo Versieux</u> from Brazil), a Saturday night banquet (Italian buffet) with a rare plant auction, and last (but not least), the biggest Bromeliad sale of the year in Florida. The Bromeliad sale (an area of almost 6,000 square feet) is open to the public on Saturday from 9 to 4.

Bromeliad growers and enthusiasts from all over Florida will bring a large selection of top quality Bromeliads for your purchasing pleasure. Those who register for the Conference will get first stab at acquiring some of these fantastic plants on Friday evening.

The hotel is the **Ramada Gateway**, 7470 W Irlo Bronson Memorial Hwy 192, Kissimmee, FL 34747. To obtain the conference rate, call the hotel (407-396-4400 or 407-997-6662 from 9am to 5pm) and ask for the special **Bromeliad Extravaganza** rates.

The special hotel room rate for Conference registrants is only \$85.80 per night (\$67.80 plus \$18 resort fee) plus 13.5% taxes. This rate includes free parking and breakfast discounts. Deluxe tower rooms are also available for only \$105 (\$87 plus \$18 resort fee). Rooms are King or 2 Queen bed rooms.

A deposit for one night's room rate plus taxes (\$67.80 plus \$9.16 or \$76.96 for the courtyard or pool view rooms) will be required at the time of booking (refundable up until 72 hours before the scheduled arrival date). The special rates will also be available from Sept. 23rd to 30th for those who would like to make a vacation out of their stay, but you need to book

before August 26th to get this special rate. Hotel check-in time is 4pm and check out time is 11am.

You should book the hotel as soon as possible.
