President's Message

We now have over 120 members. Attendance at our meetings is regularly around 60, and bumped the 70 mark a couple of months ago. There are other societies around the state with as many or more members. However, I'm told such high attendance is uncommon. Outsiders see us as energized and successful. That's nice. But, I learned long ago that it is when things seem to be going well that it is time to change. That's why there is something new from Apple every time you turn around, and nobody owns anything branded 'IBM'.

I would like to see over 70 at a typical meeting, and break 100 from time to time. That may seem crazy until you recall the typical attendance back when we met in that drab room at Reeves Methodist Church. That wasn't so long ago. There are 2.7 million people in the Orlando area. Aren't broms able to addict 0.01% of the population? That's just one person out of every 10,000. Sure they can. If we get more people in touch with broms, the broms will hook them. And, I don't mean the spines. To thrive, all BSCF needs to do is get broms in front of people and then provide information and activities that will allow the people to succeed. If we can find a venue for our annual show & sale that gets significant general public exposure, we will have taken a big step in the right direction.

At the same time, we must always focus on our meetings being worthwhile. To attend a meeting, a lot of people have to rush from work, squeeze in dinner, walk the dog, make childcare arrangements, etc., etc. Why would somebody go through all that hassle? There has to be a really good reason, even for a plant person. Having everyone leave with a door prize brom is a big deal, and so is learning something new each month and enjoying the time spent. The social and educational elements of our meetings are important. Having a routine is comfortable until it becomes boring. So, we need to keep trying new things at our meetings.

So, what do we change? Should something be eliminated? Can something be added? This month we are making a little change. When we give out the door prize broms, the first group called will be those who bring a Plant of the Month... a Big Neo. (Whether it's a 'Big Boy With Spines' or a 'Giant Gal With Spines', bring it on!) We will see how folks like it. Maybe we keep the practice, maybe not. Perhaps in the future we let Show & Tell participants choose first, too. It isn't much of a change. Sometimes, a little spice can make a dish. Maybe in July or August we change something more significant? Or, add some activity? Have an idea?

Meeting Minutes Wednesday, May 17, 2023, 7-9pm

Program: President Mike McMahon introduced speaker Grant Groves, a longtime member of BSCF who currently lives in Hernando Beach. Grant presented a stunning slide show on Bromeliads in Costa Rica, showing many species in the wild and in cultivation.

The Business Meeting was called to order by President Mike McMahon at 8:05 pm.

New Members and Guests: Recording Secretary Katherine Vaccaro invited us to welcome guest Jim Miller and new members Frances Denizard, Raquel Rivera, Jeanne Scarbraugh, Linda Scherer, and Adrie & Rick Schupp.

Minutes: The minutes of the March, 2023 meeting were published in the Newsletter. A motion was made by Tim Dreggors and seconded by Kelli Ahnen that they be approved. The motion passed.

Plant of the Month

For June I thought it would be fun to feature "Big Boys with Spines" from the Brazilian rain forest. I grow several of these sun-loving large species in my St Cloud greenhouse. Often referred to as Carcharodon types, these species include Neoregelia Giant, Rainbow, Spines, Silver, Skotak's Tiger, *silvomontana*, *gigas*, *retrorsa*, *rothinessa* and *viridovinosa*, among others. Some of these "Big Boys" can have a diameter of over 24" and even grow tall and upright. They can be found growing epiphytically in trees or as terrestrials. If you have any of these large spiny species, even if they're young specimens, please bring 'em in for our plant of the month table. Any questions? Email John Boardman at jboard55@yahoo.com

Guest Speaker - Dr Theresa Bert

Topic: "Bromeliad Taxonomy: the Taxonomists' Conundrum with the Bromeliaceae Phylogenetic Quagmire--OR, What the Heck are They Calling This Thing Now, and Do I Need to Worry about That?"

Scientists who study and classify bromeliad species are currently involved in a whirlwind of studies using genetics to define and organize bromeliad genera and species. They are finding that many bromeliad species don't belong in the genera that they've been assigned to.



We'll learn about the new genera that have been split off Tillandsia, Vriesea, and other genera in the Tillandsioideae subfamily. The new genera will impact us as bromeliad growers because, sooner or later, we'll have to change the names of some of our favorite bromeliads; and we'll need to be careful not to purchase bromeliads that we already have but don't recognize the genera names.

Dr. Terrie Bert is a longstanding member of the Sarasota Bromeliad Society (SBS) and the Caloosahatchee Bromeliad Society and has held multiple offices in the SBS. She also served the Florida Council of Bromeliad Societies (FCBS) as a representative and officer for eight years and has authored articles for the FCBS Newsletter. For the Bromeliad Society International, she has been a Florida Director, chaired several international committees, and contributed articles to the BSL Journal.

Currently, she is Librarian, Curator of the Wally Berg Award of Excellence, and a Master Judge. Terrie has given over 100 presentations on bromeliads to numerous U.S. and international bromeliad societies and other groups. She cultivates more than 2,000 different bromeliads in 30 genera. She's won multiple top awards in local bromeliad shows and BSI world conferences. Terrie has a Ph.D. in marine biology and recently retired from her position as a research scientist for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.









